# There are three elemental claims in the law.

Every preschooler knows them ...

You hurt me.
You promised me.
It's mine.

It's mine. →property

There are, fundamentally, two things the courts can do about it.

- The court can punish you.
- The court can make you make it up to the person wronged.


• The court can punish you.
